DISAPPEARING X

Cover your left eye and stare at the dot. Move the page closer and closer to your face. Suddenly, the X disappears!



Why does this happen. Because a part of your retina (the part of the back of your eye that actually sees) is open in one place where the nerves are connected to the retina. This is called the blind spot and all people have them.

If you cover your right eye instead, then stare at the X and as you move the page closer the dot will disappear.

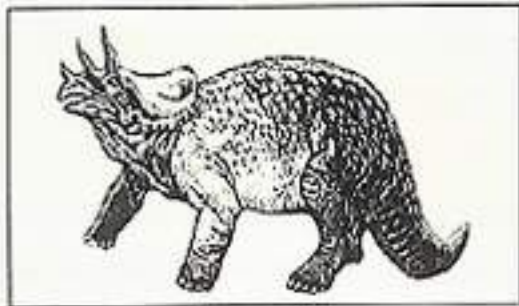
